

In the possession and care of the member by May 1<sup>st</sup>.</li> <li>B. Must be ewes or wethers born after Dec. 1<sup>st</sup> of previous year.</li> </ul> </li> <li>◆ <b>Project Animal Replacements:</b> Lambs that die between tag-in &amp; 60 days prior to Fair weigh-in may be replaced, if Ext. Office is notified by the first working day after death &amp; a Sheep Committee member sees it.</li> <li>◆ <b>May Tag-In:</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>A. Market lambs must be tagged in at the May Tag-In.</li> <li>B. A member may tag-in five (5) market lambs, show three (3) of the lambs and sell one (1) of the lambs tagged-in at Fair.</li> <li>C. <b><u>All ewes &amp; wethers must be tagged with a scrapie tag by the producer you purchase from or your family’s flock if home raised. Lambs without a scrapie tag will not be tagged with a Fair Tag and will not be eligible to show at the Clark County Fair.</u></b></li> </ul> </li> <li>◆ <b>Lost Ear Tag:</b> If a lamb loses its ear tag, you must report the lost tag to the Ext. Office, 937-328-4607. A sheep committee member will contact you for retagging. Lamb must be re-tagged before Fair.</li> <li>◆ <b>LQA:</b> Members <b><u>are required</u></b> to attend a LQA Program to show.</li> <li>◆ <b>Skillathon/Project Judging:</b> You <b><u>must participate</u></b> in the Clark Co. 4-H Skillathon/Project Judging to show at Fair.</li> <li>◆ <b>Project Book Work:</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>A. Contact the Ohio APHIS Dept. at 614-469-5602 to obtain your PREMISE ID and scrapie tags/tattoos for your/family flock.</p>	<p><b>Home Grown Requirements Continued:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>◆ <b>Designation:</b> Bring to May Tag-In to designate, read &amp; record tags.</li> <li>◆ <b>Number to Show:</b> May show a maximum of three lambs at Fair.</li> </ul> <p><b>Fair Requirements:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>◆ <b>Pen Requests:</b> Request by July 1<sup>st</sup> on Fair Pen Form return to Ext.</li> <li>◆ <b>DUNF &amp; BSE Requirement:</b> Drug Use Notification &amp; BSE Forms are <b>required</b> for market lambs at the Clark Co. Fair weigh-in.</li> <li>◆ <b>Market Lamb Arrival &amp; Release:</b> Market lambs must be in place Sat., 8:00 AM. Lambs are loaded out at the end of the sale.</li> <li>◆ <b>Weight Requirements:</b> Lambs must weigh 90 lbs-145 lbs. at fair weigh-in to sell. Under/overweight lambs ineligible for champions or to sell. Lambs must walk onto and off of scales.</li> <li>◆ <b>Health Rules: <u>Not required</u></b> for show at the Fair. Lambs must show no symptoms or evidence of an infectious or contagious disease at time of exhibition. No testicles in wethers. <b><u>All ewe lambs &amp; wethers must be identified with an official USDA Scrapie ear tag or tattoo to be shown at the County Fair.</u></b></li> <li>◆ <b>Show &amp; Sale Ring Requirements:</b> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>A. You must use your own animal for showmanship.</li> <li>B. You must show &amp; sell your own market lamb unless you have obtained official approval prior to the show or sale.</li> <li>C. You may not show the same lamb in breeding and market classes.</li> </ol> </li> <li>◆ <b>Grooming Rules:</b> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>A. Clean, dry, and slick shorn to a ¼ inch fleece.</li> <li>B. Grooming &amp; preparation of lambs on show day must be done within the sheep barn, it's perimeter &amp; west side of cattle barns.</li> <li>C. Artificial coloring, painting or changing breed characteristics is considered fraud and deception. See Ohio Livestock Tampering Rules at <a href="http://www.state.oh.us/agr/">http://www.state.oh.us/agr/</a> or contact the Fair Office.</li> </ol> </li> <li>◆ <b>Sale Rules:</b> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>A. Sell one lamb in the Auction, additional lamb(s) may be sold at packer bid. Sale order: Champions - Overall, 4-H, FFA, Div &amp; Homegrown, Premier Exh, Showmanship, &amp; Skillathon Age Div winners &amp; lottery. Overall Champs must sell &amp; be harvest.</li> <li>B. Members, who do not want to sell their market lamb, must notify the Sheep Committee in writing up to 1 hour after the show ends.</li> </ol> </li> <li>◆ <b>Premier Exhibitor:</b> All market lamb exhibitors. Earn points in Skillathon /Project Judging, Showmanship &amp; Market Classes.</li> </ul>	<p><b>Clark Co. May show a breeders flock (1 ram, lamb or yearling, 2 yearling ewes, and 2 ewe lambs owned by the same Jr. Fair exhibitor).</li> </ol> </li> <li>◆ <b>Registration Papers:</b> Only sheep registered in their respective breed association will be allowed to show in the registered classes. Registration papers will be checked and ear tag must match papers.</li> <li>◆ <b>Health Rules:</b> See Market Lamb Listing. All ewes and rams must have a USDA scrapie tag to show at the Clark Co.
