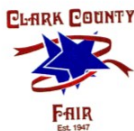

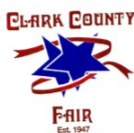

Awards - 1st-8th Place in Each Class – Ribbons

- 1. Enforcement of Rules:** All rules printed in the 2026 Clark County Junior Fair Book will apply for this show. Any rule broken will disqualify the exhibitor from this show. No exceptions!
- 2. Required Entry:** Each exhibitor must fill out an entry form. Exhibitor's parent/legal guardian and 4-H/FFA advisor must sign the entry form. The completed entry form must be returned to the Extension Office by July 1. Exhibitors must ride in the class that matches their riding and age level. One entry per exhibitor. One rider per horse.
- 3. Music Selection:** Selected music must be turned in with the entry form. Only one song on the CD. CD must be marked clearly with your name and title of song. No more than 3 1/2 minutes in length. CDs will be returned, if in error, and exhibitors will be asked to edit. If CD is not edited prior to the performance, the exhibitor will be disqualified. The music will be screened prior to the show. If the music is found to be inappropriate, the exhibitor will be asked to select a different song. GENERALLY, if the song is played on the radio, it will be found appropriate, but please keep in mind that this is a 4-H event and the music should be family friendly. If you have a question as to whether or not it is appropriate, then it probably is not.
- 4. Proper Attire and Use of Props:** All costumes and props must be pre-approved. No sharp items will be allowed. No smoke bombs or loud effects are to be used. If props are used, you will have a total of two minutes for set up and removal of props. A two-point penalty will be given if time is exceeded. Bridles must be worn but not necessarily used. Bareback riding is allowed. Back number does not need to be worn. All riders will wear boots and helmet. Motto: No shirt, no boots, no helmet and no ride. Other people may be in the ring for props. If you would like the announcer to read something over the PA during your performance, please note it on the reverse side and have it turned in to the entry booth prior to the first musical freestyle class.
- 5. Show Order and Posting:** Order to go is randomly picked; if you need to be spaced apart from someone please notify the musical freestyle advisor before noon on the day of the show. Attempts will be made to honor the request, but not guaranteed. An order to go list will be posted approximately two hours prior to the show. Exhibitors must be waiting at the gate to enter the class. This is the exhibitor's responsibility. Please help the show run as smoothly as possible. Be on time and ready to enter the horse ring when you are called. Be aware that these classes often have a lot of scratches and you might end up being called to go earlier than originally planned.
- 6. Required Moves:** All exhibitors are required to complete three required moves selected by the exhibitor from the entry form. Moves selected should be based on the rider's and horse's abilities. PLEASE NOTE: ONLY CHECK 3 ITEMS. You may perform more, but the three you choose will be the three that you are judged on.
- 7. Judging:** One judge will place each class. Points will be given for each placing and scores will be tallied to get a final score. No ties will be awarded. If there is a tie in the final score, the rider with the highest skill score will receive the higher placing.

- 8. Questions:** Please address all questions to the Musical Freestyle advisor prior to the show.
