General Rabbit Exhibitor Rules and Guidelines:

1. **Exhibitor Rules and Guidelines:** All rabbit exhibitors are required to abide by the Junior Fair Rules and Regulations, Junior Fair Livestock Special Rules, and Inspection & Health Requirements of Livestock Exhibited in Ohio listed in this Fair Book as well as the department rules to follow. Please carefully read all rules and guidelines. Note: Exhibitors must comply with Ohio's Livestock Tampering Exhibition Rules. The Clark County Fair will provide livestock exhibitors and adult advisors a copy of Chapter 901-19 (Ohio's Livestock Tampering Exhibition Rules) upon request.
 2. **Current 4-H and FFA Members:** Only currently enrolled Clark County 4-H and FFA members may show and/or sell rabbits at the Clark County Junior Fair. 4-H members must be enrolled in a club with a rabbit project (#225, #226, or #227) by **April 15th** of the current year. **FFA members must have a valid Junior Fair Entry filed on-line using Fair Entry at <http://clarkohjrfair.fairentry.com> by May 15th of the current year.**
 3. **Rabbit Exhibitor Project & Class Requirements:**
 - A. ALL 4-H and FFA Market Rabbit Project Exhibitors may show a maximum of 2 market rabbit projects (meat pen of rabbits and/or single fryer and/or roaster with a maximum of one entry per meat rabbit class. 4-H exhibitors must be enrolled in the breeding and/or market rabbit projects. **Exhibitors may only sell one market rabbit project (single fryer or meat pen or roaster) unless they have two champions.**
 - B. **ALL** 4-H and FFA Breeding Rabbit Project Exhibitors enrolled may show up to **two (2) entries per class** with **no more than 10 pens per exhibitor.** A pen = 1 buck or doe or a litter. 4-H exhibitors must be enrolled in Breeding Rabbits #225.
 - C. All 4-H Pet Rabbit Exhibitors may show up to two (2) pet rabbits -- bucks or does. Pet rabbit exhibitors may also show market &/or breeding rabbit projects. **FFA members MAY NOT show Pet rabbits!**
 4. **Rabbit Possession & Rabbit I.D. Day:**
 - A. Exhibitors must have their rabbit projects under their possession and care by **April 12, 2022.**
 - B. Exhibitors must complete the 2022 Clark County Jr. Fair Rabbit Exhibitor Registration On-Line Survey Form by **midnight, April 12, 2022.** Go to <https://go.osu.edu/2022clarkcojrfairrabbitexhibitorregistration> to complete.
 - C. Exhibitors must bring all rabbit projects to the **Rabbit I.D. Day, Saturday April 16, 9-11 AM at the Youth Building.** Each exhibitor may register as many rabbits as he or she wants. All rabbits must be tattooed in the left ear and/or have the ear tattoo recorded on this date to be eligible to be shown in any rabbit classes at the Clark County Junior Fair.
 - D. Each exhibitor must sign up for a time to bring their rabbits to Rabbit I.D. Day **by midnight April 14.** Go to <https://go.osu.edu/2022clarkcocavyandrabbitiddaytime>
 - E. Exhibitors must bring to Rabbit I.D. Day proof or knowledge of the rabbit's age. Pedigree is preferred and may be requested.
 - F. There will be a \$2/per rabbit fee charged to the exhibitor for this registration.
 - G. If a registered rabbit dies before June 1st, it may be replaced by June 1st provided the member notifies the Extension Office call **937-398-7599** or e-mail house.18@osu.edu. The exhibitor must contact a Rabbit & Poultry Committee member to have the tattoo of the new rabbit registered.
 5. **Livestock Quality Assurance:** The exhibitor must complete an annual Youth Quality Assurance program no later than 45 days prior to exhibition to show and/or sell market rabbits at the Clark Co. Jr. Fair. Each exhibitor must meet this requirement to comply with ODA Livestock Tampering Regulations.
 6. **Skill-a-thon/Project Judging:** 4-H rabbit exhibitors must bring up-to-date project book(s), record book(s), and feed tag(s) for all projects to skill-a-thon/project judging. All 4-H rabbit exhibitors must go through rabbit skill-a-thon/project judging to be eligible to show their rabbits at the Clark County Fair. Skill-a-thon awards presented during the Rabbit Show.
 7. **Outstanding Project Book:** 4-H and FFA members wishing to enter the Outstanding Rabbit Project Book Contest must submit their project book(s) for judging when they participate in the Skill-a-thon/Project Judging. Project books will be judged and available for pick-up by the member at fair check-in/weigh-in and during the show. Project Book awards presented during the Rabbit Show.
 8. **Health Requirements:** Health papers are not required, but rabbits must be free of contagious and infectious diseases. Rabbits checked for disease at check-in. The Rabbit & Poultry Committee in consultation with the Fair Vet will dismiss rabbits declared diseased or unworthy of show from fairgrounds.
 9. **Authorized Showman and Seller:** Exhibitors must show and/or sell their own rabbits(s) on the judging table and/or in the ring. If an exhibitor is unable to show or sell his/her own rabbits, the exhibitor must get permission from the Jr Fair Rabbit & Poultry Committee for another exhibitor to show and/or sell their rabbit.
 10. **Dress Code:** **All rabbit exhibitors MUST wear a long sleeve shirt or lab coat, plain shirt, or club/chapter t- shirt, closed toed shoes, pants, shorts, skirts, dresses below mid-thigh to enter the show ring.** No cut-offs -- shirts or pants, no spaghetti, tank, or tube tops. Automatic disqualification from the show for any exhibitor that comes inappropriately dressed.
 11. **Authorized Ring Personnel:** Only Junior Fair exhibitors and show staff allowed in cage area during the rabbit show unless barn or show superintendents or personnel grant special assistance.
12. **Barn Rules:**
 - A. Only rabbits that were registered on Rabbit Identification Day in April and checked in at the Fair may be housed in the rabbit barn. **A maximum per pen is three rabbits with the mother. Extra rabbit from**

litters are not permitted to be housed at the Fair!

- B. May not use carrier cages for housing rabbits at the Fair.
 - C. **Attachable** receptacles for feed and water **are strongly recommended and** must be present before animals will be cooped. Paper, Styrofoam, glass or **ceramic receptacles for feed or water ARE NOT PERMITTED. Springs are required to secure water bottles to the cages. No strings or zip ties.**
 - D. **Pen risers of the exact pen size 20" x 20" may be used.** Bedding must be placed underneath the pens to absorb moisture. Exhibitors must clean pens daily by **8 AM**. Place used bedding in the designated area by the swine barn only. **No puppy pads!**
 - E. Exhibitor must clean and take down pens by 5 PM the last Friday of Fair. Failure to comply may result in not showing the following year. If the pen is not cleaned out, the exhibitor will not sell in the auction and/or will forfeit auction premiums received. 4-H Clubs and/or FFA chapters will be charged \$50 per exhibitor's pen that is not cleaned out and torn down by the designated time.
 - F. No locks on cages.
 - G. All exhibitors are required to supply all feed and bedding (wood chips – no cedar) for their rabbits.
 - H. **All decorations must be above the rabbit pens this includes the lattice backing as well as bows, posters, name boards, etc.**
 - I. Do not post "For Sale" signs before noon Wednesday of Fair. Sold rabbits may not leave the rabbit barn until 7:30 PM, Thursday.
 - J. Rabbit & Poultry Committee members will inspect pens and cages daily to ensure that all rabbits are properly cared for by the exhibitor (i.e. – fed, watered, clean rabbit and pen, etc.). Pens and/or rabbits not cared for will be tagged with a colored card (yellow – 1st time, orange – 2nd time, and red – 3rd time). Exhibitors, whose rabbit pens tagged with a red card, will forfeit all awards and premiums including Jr. Fair Auction money.
 - K. Exhibitors are responsible for caring for their animals until loaded onto the packer truck or taken home upon dismissal. Exhibitors in violation of this rule will forfeit all auction rights including packer bids and/or auction premiums.
 - L. Failure to comply with any barn rules may result in not being able to exhibit the following year.
13. **Rule Observance:** Ignorance of rules is no excuse for violation. All rules and regulations found within the digital Jr. Fair Book, 4-H Project Selection & Requirement Guide, and/or the Clark Co. Fair website <http://clarkcoag.com>. Failure to adhere can result in disqualification from show and/or auction and/or withholding or overturning premiums, awards and/or auction check from the exhibitor.
14. **Resolution Committee:**
- A. The Junior Fair Rabbit & Poultry Committee reserves the right to rule on items or interpretations of all rules and items not stated.
 - B. When satisfactory evidence has been obtained by the Junior Fair Board Rabbit & Poultry Committee that any rabbit rules have been violated, the exhibitor and/or exhibitor's family may be barred from the showing of rabbits at the Clark County Fair for at least one (1) year.
15. **Protests:**
- A. **The appropriate species committees and/or Jr. Fair Auction Committee, Junior, and Senior Fair Boards will handle protests specific to department rules governing shows, events, contests, and auction.** Protests must be made in writing accompanied with a **\$50.00** check made payable to the Clark Co. Fair Board and presented to the chairperson of the specific Jr Fair Dept., refundable if the protest is allowed.
 - B. In the event of a protest arising over the interpretation of 4-H exhibitor eligibility requirements (i.e. – skill-a-thon completion, age/grade requirements, club meeting requirements, activity fee requirements, dual projects, etc.), such protest must be made in writing, accompanied with a \$50 check, refundable if protest is allowed and filed in the 4-H office at the Youth Building. The Clark County 4-H Extension Educator and the Clark County 4-H Advisory Committee's Resolution Committee will review the written protest and take appropriate action.
 - C. The team of Agri-Science instructors govern FFA exhibitor eligibility and interpretation. FFA exhibitors must file written FFA protests accompanied with a \$50 check in the FFA office of the Youth Building for review, interpretation, and action.
16. **Fair Suspension:** When satisfactory evidence has been obtained by the Clark County Agricultural Society Board of Directors that any individual(s) have been suspended from participation in a fair or exposition, the individual(s) is suspended from equivalent participation at the Clark County Fair for a congruent period. Any person, so suspended, may appeal said suspension to the Clark County Agricultural Society Board of Directors by filing for such an appeal in writing at least seven (7) days prior to the opening of the Clark County Fair. (Enacted 3/25/92 – Clark County Fair Board).

Pet Rabbit Rules and Guidelines:

1. **Pet Rabbit Fair Eligibility Requirements: No FFA entries allowed in this division!**

- A. Pet rabbit member/exhibitor must participate in the Rabbit Skill-a-thon to complete the project.
- B. Pet rabbit exhibitor may exhibit a maximum of two (2) pet rabbits, mix breed, any age, buck, or doe.
- C. Exhibitors must have their pet rabbit projects under their possession and care by **April 12, 2022**.
- D. Exhibitors must complete the 2022 Clark County Jr. Fair Rabbit Exhibitor Registration On-Line Survey Form **by midnight, April 12, 2022**. Go to <https://go.osu.edu/2022clarkcojrfairrabbitexhibitorregistration> to complete.
- E. Each exhibitor must sign up for a time to bring their rabbits to Rabbit I.D. Day **by midnight April 14**. Go to <https://go.osu.edu/2022clarkcocavyandrabbitiddaytime>
- F. Pet rabbits must register at the annual **Rabbit I.D. Day held Saturday, April 16 at the Youth Building** to be eligible to show at the Clark County Fair.
- G. Pet rabbits will show in one class and the Rabbit Show will begin with the Pet Rabbit Class.
- H. All other rabbit rules apply.
- I. Jr. Fair Management will make entry pet entries for all 4-H members based on the information collected at the **Rabbit I.D. Day and on the Rabbit Exhibitor Registration on-line survey**.

Fancy & Commercial Rabbit Breed Rules and Guidelines:

1. Fancy & Commercial Rabbit Fair Eligibility Requirements:

- A. Exhibitors must have their rabbit projects under their possession and care **by April 12, 2022.**
- B. **Any breeding rabbits not owned by the exhibitor or exhibitor's immediate family requires the exhibitor to file a lease agreement between the exhibitor and the leesor (animal's owner) by April 16 at the Extension Office. (ORC 901-19-39) The lease form is available at [https://clark.osu.edu under Applications and Forms and, also on the 4-H App.](https://clark.osu.edu/under/Applications%20and%20Forms%20and%20also%20on%20the%204-H%20App)**
- C. Exhibitors must complete the 2022 Clark County Jr. Fair Rabbit Exhibitor Registration On-Line Survey Form by **midnight, April 12, 2022.** Go to <https://go.osu.edu/2022clarkcojrfairrabbitexhibitorregistration> to complete.
- D. Each exhibitor must sign up for a time to bring their rabbits to Rabbit I.D. Day **by midnight April 14.** Go to <https://go.osu.edu/2022clarkcocavyandrabbitiddaytime>
- E. All rabbits must register at the annual **Rabbit I.D. Day held Saturday, April 16 at the Youth Building to be eligible to show at the Clark County Fair.**
- F. Exhibitors may exhibit up to two (2) entries per class up to **10 pens** per exhibitor. **A pen = 1 buck; 1 doe; 1 litter; 1 meat pen; or 1 single fryer or 1 roaster**
 - a. Litters, meat pen, and single fryers:
 - Must be **65 days to 70 days** of age at fair check-in.
 - Must be from a registered buck and doe brought to Rabbit I.D. Day.
 - Litters and/or meat pens must be three rabbits from the same registered doe. No mixing of offspring to make animals match in the litter or meat pen classes.
 - Litters must be housed together and weaned before Fair.
- G. Litters tattooed to show at fair. An individual will be available to tattoo at fair check in.
- H. There will be a \$2/rabbit charge to register your litter at fair. Maximum cost for 3 rabbits is \$6.
- I. Jr. Fair Management will make on-line entry (Fair Entry) for all 4-H & FFA members rabbits based on the information collected at the **Rabbit I.D. Day and on the Rabbit Exhibitor Registration on-line survey.**

2. Show Order:

- a. Breeds will show alphabetically within 4-class and 6-class divisions as printed in the show bill. 4-Class breeds will show on Table 1 and 6-Class breeds will show on Table 2. Bucks and does will show separately. If there are ten or more rabbits within a breed class, the committee reserves the right to break the class into recognized varieties.
- b. 4-H and FFA exhibitor's rabbits will show together.

Market Rabbit Pen Rules and Guidelines:

1. Rabbit Meat Pen, Fryer and Roaster Requirements:

- A. ALL 4-H and FFA Rabbit Project Exhibitors may exhibit in a maximum of two market rabbit classes and may not enter two in the same market rabbit class. The single fryer may not be part of the meat pen of rabbits. Overweight single fryers and/or meat pen rabbits may not be shown in

- the roaster classes. Exhibitors may sell only one market rabbit project (single fryer or meat pen or roaster) unless they have two champions.
- B. Market rabbits (single fryer, meat pen or roaster) may be from any recognized commercial type rabbit breed **and must be purebred**. The optimal breeds for meat rabbits are New Zealand and Californian. Additional breeds permitted for the meat classes include French Angora, Giant Angora, Satin Angora, Blanc De Hotot, Champaign d'Argent, Cinnamon, American Chinchilla, Crème d'Argent, French Lop, Harlequin, Palomino, Rex, American Sable, Satin, Silver Fox, and Silver Marten.
 - C. **Meat Pen and Single Fryer:** A meat pen consists of three (3) meat breed rabbits of the same breed. A fryer is one (1) commercial rabbit. Meat pens and fryers must come from a buck and doe registered at registration day and from the same registered doe no mixing of offspring. Each rabbit in the meat pen or the single fryer must be **65 to 70 days** of age at the time of weigh-in and **weigh 3 ½ to 5 ½ pounds each** at Fair Weigh-In **to be eligible to show and/or sell**. **Minimum** weight variances will be allowed. The buck and doe that is going to produce the exhibitor's meat pen and/or single fryer must be registered on the **2022 Clark County Jr. Fair Rabbit Exhibitor On-Line Survey Form by midnight April 12**. Go to <https://go.osu.edu/2022clarkcojrfairrabbithexhibitorregistration> to complete. Exhibitors must also bring the buck and doe to **Rabbit I.D. Day on Saturday, April 16, 9 AM to 11 AM at the Youth Building** to be tattooed or have tattoos read.
 - D. **Single Market Roaster:** A market roaster is one (1) meat breed rabbit born after January 23rd and at least 8 weeks of age by Rabbit I.D. Day (April 16, 2022). Exhibitors may register 3 roasters show 1 and sell 1. Exhibitors may purchase rabbit(s) for their roasters or breed them. Roasters must weigh **6 to 9 pounds** and be less than 6 months of age at Fair weigh-in to be eligible to show and/or sell. **Minimum** weight variances will be allowed. The market roaster(s) must be registered on the 2022 Clark County Jr. Fair Rabbit Exhibitor On-Line Survey Form by **midnight April 12**. Go to <https://go.osu.edu/2022clarkcojrfairrabbithexhibitorregistration> to complete. Each exhibitor must sign up for a time to bring their rabbits to Rabbit I.D. Day **by midnight April 14**. Go to <https://go.osu.edu/2022clarkcocavyandrabbitiddaytime> Exhibitors must also bring the roaster to **Rabbit I.D. Day on Saturday, April 16, 9 AM to 11 AM at the Youth Building** to be tattooed or have tattoos read.
 - E. Meat Pens & Single Fryers must be tattooed to show at Fair. Someone will be tattooing at Fair check in.
 - F. There will be a \$2 per rabbit charge to register your meat pen and/or single fryer at fair. Maximum cost for a meat pen is \$6. Single fryer cost is \$2. No refunds given for rabbits not making weight.
 - G. Exhibitors must provide proof that all meat pens and single fryers came from a buck and a doe registered at Rabbit I.D. Day. (Example: pedigree). This buck and doe must be of the same breed and variety as the meat pen/single fryer and be registered in Market Project #226. Registration of the buck and doe in the Commercial Division of the Junior Fair Show is required.
 - H. Exhibitors cannot show meat rabbits (single fryers, meat pen or roasters) in any other class. Any meat rabbit that does not make weight must go home after weigh-in.
 - I. Market rabbits going to auction or on the packer truck will be **loaded out on Wed., July 27, 6 PM**.
2. **Weigh-In and Division of Classes:**
 - A. Rabbit meat pens, single fryers, and roasters split into weight classes only if entries deem this necessary.
 - B. Rabbit meat pen, single fryers and roasters weighed **ONCE** by the third-party weigh master selected by the Senior Fair Board weigh master between **7 PM to 8 PM** the first Friday of Fair.
 - C. All weigh masters have the final say on weights.
 3. **After-Exhibition Animal Declaration On-Line Survey Form:**
 - A. Each market rabbit exhibitor must complete an on-line "After Exhibition Animal Declaration Form" indicating where their market rabbit is headed after exhibition. This electronic form must be completed and submitted on-line no later than 30 minutes after Fair weigh-in is completed.
 - B. The After-Exhibition Animal Declaration Form serves to assist the Rabbit & Poultry Committee, Sale Management and Fair personnel in tracking where market rabbits need to go after the conclusion of exhibition thus helping to reduce load-out, auction and packer mishaps.
 - C. Failure to complete and submit this on-line form by the designated deadline will result in forfeiture of the right to sell a market rabbit in this year's Clark County Jr. Fair Livestock Auction
 4. **Auction:**
 - A. **Each exhibitor may sell ONLY ONE ELIGIBLE ANIMAL UNIT TOTAL (regardless of species) in the Clark Co. Jr. Fair Auction except for Champions.**
 - B. Grand and Reserve Champion Singler Fryer, Single Roaster, and Meat Pen must sell in the Sale of Champions and if an exhibitor has multiple champions, they will sell all champions.
 - C. **Exhibitors to sell in the Sale of Champions will need to move their Champion animals to the designated Hall of Champions area on the day and time set by the Sales Committee.**
 - D. For complete Auction information, you must refer to the 2022 Clark Co. Jr. Fair Auction Rules.

Showmanship Rules and Guidelines:

1. **Age Eligibility:** All ages are based on the exhibitor's age as of January 1st of the current year.
2. **Registration:** 4-H and FFA members must make entry for showmanship using Fair Entry On-line at <http://clarkohirfair.fairentry.com> by July 1st. Exhibitors must verify they will be showing in showmanship at Rabbit Check-In or Weigh-In on Friday, July 22.
3. **Designated Animal:** The exhibitor does have to use his/her own rabbit in the showmanship contest.
4. **Time of Show and Show Order:** Rabbit showmanship will start at **5 PM on Monday, July 25**.
5. **Progression:** All exhibitors may participate in showmanship to earn points for Premier Exhibitor competition, even if they have won their division in previous years. Previous division winners do not move up a division.
4. **Showman of Showmen Eligibility:** There will be no overall rabbit showman. The Senior Showmanship winner will represent the rabbit division in the Showman of Showmen competition. If the Senior Showman Division winner declines or has already competed as the Showman of Showmen representative for Rabbits, the eligibility goes to the 2nd place Senior Showmanship Division exhibitor and continues through 5th place of the Senior Showmanship Division. If there is no one eligible through 5th place, there will be no representative for rabbits in Showman of Showmen.

 - B. Serve as a youth representative on the 4-H & FFA Rabbit Committee, if at least 13 years of age.

1. **Eligibility:** Any 4-H or FFA member currently enrolled with a rabbit project (Pet, Breeding – Fancy or Commercial or Market) may compete if they meet all rabbit exhibition rules.
2. **Age:** All ages are based on the exhibitor's age as of January 1st of the current year.
3. **Criteria:** Competing members earn points from Rabbit Skill-a-thon/Project Judging, Rabbit Showmanship and Class Placing in the Rabbit classes. **Skill-a-thon Score worth 30%, Project Interview 10%, Project Book 10%, Showmanship 25% and Class Placing 25%.** Age division and overall winners

recognized at Showman of Showmen, Thurs., July 28, 2 PM in the Expo Center. Results posted in the Rabbit Barn and 4-H Winners Board in the Youth Building by Noon, Thurs., July 28.

4. **Tie Breaker:** In case of a tie, the following criteria will be used:

First Tie Breaker: Overall Skill-a-thon Score, 2nd Tie Breaker: Total Tie Breaker Points in Skill-a-thon, 3rd Tie Breaker: Showmanship Placing, 4th Tie Breaker: Highest Overall Animal Rank in the Show.
