- B. Based on the flower bed(s) selected, 4-H clubs will receive a check at the Spring Flower Bed Meeting on May 2, 6:30 at the Extension Office to purchase plants to be used in the flower bed. Plants may be purchased from the vendor of the club's choice. A copy of the receipt(s) of plants purchased must be provided to the Clark County Extension Office by June 20 for accountability of funds provided by the Clark County Agricultural Society via distribution through the Clark Co. 4-H Committee to the participating 4-H clubs.
- C. The fairgrounds will provide mulch (for your use) and uniform signs for the flower beds.
- D. General maintenance consists of watering (hoses and water are generally located near flower beds) and weeding of assigned spots. The clubs will provide for any tools required.
- E. All plantings MUST be completed by June 20. Any flower bed area not planted by this date will be given to another club.
- F. All maintenance must be provided during normal grounds hours 8 AM to 10 PM, Mon through Sat.

If an event is going on during the weekend it is difficult to get to the beds. Please try and care for beds during the week. Beds must be maintained from the time of planting until the first killing frost.

- H. Clubs are encouraged to plant spring bulbs after fall clean up. Fall clean up consists of removing all dead plants and raking bed smooth. This will make your spring work easier.
