What Are The Behavior Expectations of 4-H Participants?

Ohio 4-H Code of Conduct

- Adhere to program rules, curfews, dress codes, policies, and rules of the facility being used.
- Conduct themselves in a courteous, ethical, respectful manner, use appropriate language (including not using profanity), exhibit good sportsmanship, and provide positive role models.
- 3. Abstain from illegal behaviors, use of alcohol, illegal or illicit drugs, tobacco in any form, and/or any vaping products during 4-H events and activities.
- 4. Fully participate in scheduled activities.
- 5. Respect other's property and privacy rights.
- 6. Abstain from child abuse (physical and/or verbal) harassment, and actions that bully, ridicule, dominate, or display inappropriate behavior toward others.
- Accept personal responsibility for behavior, destruction or theft of property including any financial damage.
- 8. Be responsible for any financial damage caused by inappropriate behavior.
- 9. Adhere to rules of safety.
- 10. Follow Ohio and county laws and regulations related to the care, handling, and possession of animals and living creatures.
- 11. Operate machinery, vehicles, and any other required equipment in a responsible manner in accordance with the directives of OSU Extension personnel and Ohio and county laws and regulations.
- 12. I will uphold and support the responsible and lawful use of social media. In so doing, I will not create or post social media content that is abusive, threatening, defamatory, obscene, harassing, or creates a hostile environment.
- 13. Follow the Ohio State University Standards of Behavior for Minor Participants Participating in Activities and Programs with Minor Participants.

As a program participant in OSU Extension, 4-H participants must practice good citizenship, leadership and self-control and not engage in discriminatory behavior, which includes harassment, discrimination, sexual misconduct, and retaliation.

This means you should not exclude anyone from participating in any program or activity, or discriminate against them because of their identity. Identity includes: age, ancestry, color, disability, ethnicity, gender, gender identity or expression, genetic information, HIV/AIDS status, military status, national origin, pregnancy, race, religion, sex, sexual orientation, or protected veteran status.

A full definition of harassment and discrimination can be found in the Affirmative Action, Equal Employment Opportunity, and Non-Harassment/Discrimination policy.

Consequences for violating any part of this code of conduct may include, but are not limited to: removal from the 4-H program; removal from participation in the event in which the code of conduct has been violated (at the individual's expense); forfeiture of financial support; sanctions on or being banned from participating in future 4-H events; removal from leadership positions and/or offices held, etc. When warranted (e.g., violation of law) the situation may be turned over to the appropriate law enforcement authority.

4-H members and their parents/legal guardians are required to agree to the 4-H Code of Conduct during the annual on-line enrollment process.

What Are The Special Fair Requirements for Projects?







Quality Assurance: 4-H members with Market Beef, Market Dairy Steer, Market Hog, Market Lamb, Market Goat, Market Turkey, Market Chicken, Market Duck, Market Rabbits, Lactating Dairy Cows and/or Lactating Dairy Goats must complete the ANNUAL quality assurance (QA) **no later than**June 1 to show and/or sell at the Clark County and/or Ohio State Fairs.

EquiSTEP: All 4-H horse project members will need to complete the on-line EquiSTEP program no later than May 1.

Go to http://go.osu.edu/equistep2024 to complete.

Dog, Horse and Shooting Sports Permission to Participate: Members that enroll in these projects will be prompted to read and accept these permission to participate forms as part of the on-line 4-H enrollment process no later than April 15.

Skill-a-thon and Project Judging: All 4-H members must participate in Skill-a-thon/Project judging with an up-to-date current project book to complete their projects and be eligible to show at the Clark County and/or Ohio State Fairs. If you need to make-up skill-a-thon or project judging, you must submit a Makeup Skill-a-thon Project Judging Request no later than July 10, 2024. Health Requirements: All animals must be free of any contagious or infectious disease upon arrival and throughout Fair week. For specific requirements per species see the Clark County Jr. Fair Book at http://clark.osu.edu and http://clark.osu.edu and http://clarkcoag.com/.

What Does My Child Need To Do in 4-H?

◆ 4-H Club Meetings

- Attend at least six 4-H club meetings and/or activities.
- Participate in community service, leadership, fundraising, recreational and/or educational activities.
- Come with a positive attitude eager to Learn by Doing the 4-H way through project work, public speaking and hands-on activities.
- Serve as a club officer, on a committee, as a Jr. Leader or mentor.
- Support club goals and activities.

For Projects

- Select at least one 4-H project to complete.
 Use 4-H Project Central on-line to get a sneak peak of each project or the 2024 4-H Family Guide.
- Meet all project requirements and guidelines.
 Refer to the 2024 Clark County 4-H Requirement Guide on-line at http://clark.osu.edu
- Attend required programs for Fair participation, weigh-in, tag-in, ID day, quality assurance (QA), EquiSTEP, skill-a-thon, project judging, etc.

For Skill-a-thon & Project Judging

- Up-to-date Project Book: Required for all projects!
 Complete required sections to be eligible for County and State Fair participation. Make sure to include a feed tag/ration, quality assurance certificate & project experiences documentation. <u>A current up-to-date project book is a REQUIREMENT to have a completed project eligible for FAIR!</u>
- **Project Interview:** Prepare for a one-on-one interview with an adult to answer questions about your project and 4-H experience.
- **Skill-a-thon:** All animal projects! Prepare to participate in four to five hands-on skill assessment stations. Use your project book, resource handbook, skill-a-thon, quality assurance kits, project clinics and workshops to prepare. Check out digital links at http://clark.osu and on the 4-H App.
- Miscellaneous Projects: Bring item made, created, produced, grown, or designed and/or visual educational display (tri-fold, poster, collage, etc.) to the judging & interview.
- Be Patient and Positive! While you wait for judging, review your project book, bring something to read or chat with a friend. Chairs are limited, so bring a lawn or sports chair too!

- Project Care: Assure quality care for your animals at all times. Keep stalls and animals clean, fed, watered and presentable to the public. You are in the public spotlight - make your actions count!
