Who: 4-H members age 8 and in 3rd
grade to age 18.

Classes: No pre-entry required.

- **Class 400 - Interlock Building Craze** (use your engineering and creativity to build something from interlocking building blocks)
- **Class 401 - Mini Garden** (create a miniature garden using artificial plants and items)
- **Class 402 - Upcycle Funk** (repurpose something old into something new, create art from junk)
- **Class 403 - My Picasso** (any painting, drawing, sketching using watercolors, pencils, acrylics, chalk, markers, crayons, paint, etc.)
- **Class 404 - Tye Dye (Any item made using a tye dye process)**
- **Class 405 - Card Making - (Create a card to send using your creativity)**
- **Class 406 - Cake Decorating** (not to exceed 8 inch any shape Styrofoam base with any icing style - no real cakes or bakery base products.)
- **Class 407 - String Art** (Create a piece of art of your choice using string in the art piece).
- **Class 408 - Nature Art (Art made completely from items found in nature)**

- **Class 409 - DIY Jewelry** (create a wearable art using any of the following beads, wire, thread, parachord, embroidery floss, fabric, paper, plastic)
- **Class 410 - Pet Toy** (create a piece of art that also doubles as a toy for your pet)

Requirements:

- A. Member may enter one entry per class. Member must have created the creative masterpiece entry.
- B. Deliver entries Fri., July 19, 9 AM -9 PM, Youth Bldg.
- C. Pick-Up entries on Fri., July 26, 3 PM to 6 PM, Youth Bldg.

Judging Criteria: Entries will be judged on the use of color, texture, line, form, space, movement and value.

Upcycle Art: Must repurpose something(s) old into a work of art.

Garden Art: Create art to display in a garden or create or repurpose something into a container to become a vessel for plants. Garden Art may include live plants if the art designed is meant to hold or contain plants.

Digital Art: art created using technology – computer generated, 3-D printers, drones, etc.



Eligibility Requirements:

- Open to current 4-H members, age 8 and in the 3rd grade to age 18 as of January 1st.
- Member must be willing to sell winning entry in the Auction.

- Exhibitor may make entry in a maximum of two classes, but is only eligible to sell in one entry in the Auction.**
- Previous first place winners not allowed to enter the same class the following year.

Judging and Auction Procedures:

- Bring your art item(s) to the Youth Building Sat., July 20, Noon-1 PM. When you bring your item, you will be asked to sign up for a specific judging time between 1 PM and 4 PM to eliminate the waiting time and lines.
- Interviews and judging of participants with art item will be from 1 PM to 4 PM based on selected judging times. If you have a conflict with another Jr. Fair event, please let the contest officials know when you check-in and select a judging time that will minimize that conflict.
- Entries will be judged on the principles of art and design as they relate to each art medium and the members knowledge and application of those.
- All placings by the judge are final and will be respected. Awards announced at 5 PM in the Youth Building.
- First place art items will be auctioned at 5:30 PM, Thursday, July 25 prior to the Wood Carving Auction in the Arts & Crafts Building.
- Contestants may only sell one 1st Place Art Item in the Art Auction. If a member has more than one winning entry, they must declare after awards are announced which entry they plan to sell. The next eligible placing will be notified of their eligibility to sell in the Auction. The artist must be present with their art item to be judged and sold in the auction.
- All first-place winners will be drawn for auction order. Best of Show Jr. and Best of Show Sr. will sell first.

Auction Commission and Checks:

- Sellers will receive the selling art item price minus a 5% commission and \$5.00 fee.
- Auction checks will be mailed to the seller when all their buyers have paid in full and their checks have cleared.
