Must be qualified single dairy breed castrated male calves of the Holstein or Brown Swiss breed ONLY! No Ayrshire, Guernsey, Jersey or Milking Shorthorn allowed! B. Feeders may not exhibit any beef breed characteristics including, but not limited to, white eyes and bald faces. C. In the possession and care of the member by May 1st. D. Members must complete the Clark Co. Jr. Fair Dairy Feeder Exhibitor Reg. On-line Survey by midnight May 1 listing all dairy feeders they are bringing to the May tag-in/weigh-in. Go to https://go.osu.edu/2024clarkcojrfairdairyfeederexhreg E. Must be castrated and dehorned by May tag-in. F. Any calf that does not meet this requirement WILL NOT BE TAGGED OR WEIGHED but will be PICTURED. By June 1 the calf must get 1st vaccinations, be properly castrated and/or dehorned. Upon providing proof to Dairy Com. Chair, the calf will be tagged. You must get calf's 2nd vaccinations by July 1. Calf not eligible for Rate of Gain. ◆ May Tag-In and Evaluation: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> A. Feeders must be brought to the May Tag-In to be weighed, tagged, vaccinated and wormed. B. A third party dairy evaluator hired by the Fair Board will inspect every dairy feeder to determine if it is a qualified single dairy breed male using breed standard color markings as described above. Calves evaluated for absence of severe abnormalities (ie. Hernias) and desirable dairy conformation traits as well. Any decision made by the dairy evaluator on a dairy feeder's qualification as a single dairy breed of Holstein or Brown Swiss is FINAL! See next page for complete criteria. 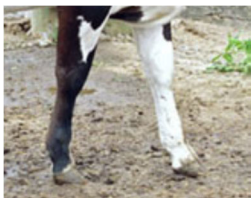
Use This Breed Characteristic Criteria for Dairy Feeder Selection!

Legs

- Black or red hair on one or more legs beginning at the hoof and extending unbroken to or above the knee is considered “not” to be breed standard.
- One or more legs encircled with black or red hair which touches the hoof at any point is considered “not” to be breed standard.

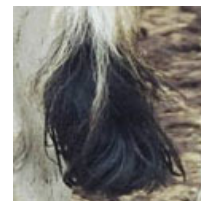
BROWN SWISS – Source Ohio State University Extension Dairy Resource Handbook

While the majority of Brown Swiss calves are born white/cream in color, their color will change with age.

There are still characteristics that can be seen and recognized when looking at a calf.

- A solid dark charcoal grey/black nose (no spots).
- Solid dark charcoal gray/black hooves (no dis-colorings).
- The switch should be a chocolate brown/black (no light shades).

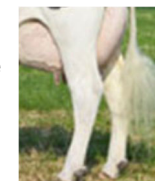
Dairy Feeders may not exhibit any beef breed characteristics including, but not limited to, white eyes and bald faces.

Tail

- No black or red hair arising from the extreme 5 cms of the tail bone.
- The last 5 cms of the tail bone must be white.

A dairy feeder may be replaced under the following circumstances after receiving approval from the Jr. Fair Dairy Committee: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➔ Tagged dairy feeder dies between the May tag-in date and June 1st; ➔ Is ruled unqualified by the dairy evaluator at the May tag-in; ➔ Has an umbilical hernia as determined by the Fair veterinarian at the May Tag-in. The replacement calf will not be eligible for Rate of Gain and must be tagged and photographed by a Jr. Fair Dairy Committee member. B. If a member's dairy feeder dies after June 1, the member may show and sell an extra project tagged by a sibling from the same household (permanent residence address of the member). C. Must have vaccinated dairy feeders with 2nd dose of 4-way and 7-way vaccine given by a licensed veterinarian no later than July 1. Feeders will not be weighed in at Fair if not vaccinated by July 1 and proof provided if not given at one of the countywide sites. B. Feeders with an umbilical hernia or unsightly repairs may not show or sell. 117DF Dairy Feeder		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ◆ Weight Requirements: <u>Weigh between 350 - 650 lbs. at Fair weigh-in</u> to be eligible for inclusion in the Jr. Fair Auction unit. Ideal weight 400-600 lbs. at Fair. Calves weighing 300 to 349 lbs. may show in showmanship and an underweight class, but are not eligible for the champions, Premier Exhibitor points or the auction unit. These calves may go on the packer truck. Any calf weighing under 300 lbs. must go home by 8 AM, Sat., July 20. ◆ Quality Assurance, Drug Use Notification (DUNF) and UPI Exhibition Livestock Producers Affidavit: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> A. The exhibitor must have completed an annual Youth Quality Assurance program by June 1 to exhibit his/her dairy feeder at the Clark Co. Jr. Fair. ODA added dairy feeders effective May 15, 2024 and goes into effect for the 2024 Fair season. B. The exhibitor and/his/her parent/legal guardian must complete, sign, and submit an on-line Drug Use Notification Form (DUNF) on each of his/her market dairy steers by Noon, Friday, July 19. Dairy Feeders will not be weighed-in without this on-line form completed. ODA added dairy feeders effective May 15, 2024 and goes into effect for the 2024 Fair season. C. The exhibitor and his/her parent/legal guardian must complete, sign, and submit an on-line UPI Livestock Producers Affidavit by noon, Friday July 19 for his/her market dairy steers to verify to packers that your dairy market steers have not been fed ruminant derived animal proteins. ◆ Show Ring Requirements: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> A. Show dairy feeders in a white shirt or club/chapter white shirt and blue jeans with no holes or wear white clothes. No hats allowed! B. Exhibitors may use show sticks at their discretion when showing. ◆ After Exhibition Animal Declaration Form: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> A. Each dairy feeder exhibitor must complete an on-line "After Exhibition Animal Declaration Form" indicating where each dairy feeder will be headed after exhibition. This electronic form must be completed and submitted on-line no later than 30 minutes after Fair weigh-in is completed. B. The After-Exhibition Animal Declaration Form serves to assist the Dairy Committee, Sale Management and Fair personnel in tracking where dairy feeders need to go after the Conclusion of exhibition thus helping to reduce load-out, auction, custom and packer mishaps. C. Failure to complete and submit this on-line form by the designated deadline will result in forfeiture of the right to sell a dairy feeder in this year's Clark County Jr. Fair Livestock Auction. ◆ Barn Rules: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> A. Care for (feed, water, clean and make presentable) all dairy animals, pens, stalls and barn aiseways for the public by 9 AM daily and throughout the Fair. B. All animals giving evidence of any unacceptable practices or prohibited grooming practices as outlined in 901-19-13 and 901-19-33 of Ohio's Livestock Tampering Rules will be barred from competition at the Clark Co. Fair. B. Drenching of livestock at any exhibition is prohibited except as permitted for a medical condition when diagnosed by a licensed veterinarian. Drenching means the action of using an instrument including a bottle, placed in an animal's mouth to orally administer a liquid, food, or any other substance. ◆ Premier Exhibitor: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> A. Pts. for Skill-a-thon /Project Judge, Mkt, and Showmanship. Skill-a-thon Score worth 30%, Project Interview 10%, Project Book 10%, Showmanship 25% and Class Placing 25%. B. Projects tagged/unsanitary condition lose 20 pts. C. Age, division and overall winner announced at Showman of Showmen, Thurs., July 25, 3 PM. D. Overall Market Dairy Feeder/Dairy Market Steer Premier Exhibitor can sell in the Sale of Champions. E. Results posted in the Cattle Barns, Cattle Arena and Youth Building by Noon, Thurs., July 25. ◆ Auction: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> A. Each exhibitor may participate in the Auction with <u>ONE UNIT (OVERALL JR. FAIR ELIGIBLE MARKET EXPERIENCE)</u>. This unit consists of all eligible market projects in the Clark Co. Jr. Fair Auction (live or on-line) except for Champions. B. Grand and Reserve Champion Dairy Feeder must sell in the Sale of Champions and if an exhibitor has multiple champions they will sell all champions. C. Overall Market Dairy Beef Premier Exhibitor may sell in the Sale of Champions but are not required to do so unless also one of the Dairy Feeder or Dairy Market Steer Champions. D.
