May enter and show only 2 animals per goat class. Pregnant does due in July can't be shown. Birthdates and scrapie tags/tattoos required. Check Jr. Fair Book Goat section for classes. ♦ Pen Requests: Due July 1st on your 4-H Club's Fair Pen Form. ♦ DUNF Req.: A DUNF is not required for specialty goats. ♦ Goat Arrival and Release: Must arrive by 7 PM, Fri., July 19 and are released at the conclusion of the show on Tuesday. ♦ Check-In Required to Show: 5 PM to 7 PM, Fri., July 19, outside of Goat Barn 1. ♦ Health Rules: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> A. Health papers are not required for show at the county fair. B. Animals must show no symptoms or evidence of an infectious or contagious disease at time of exhibition. C. Official USDA Scrapie tag/tattoo/electronic chip required for all goats.
