Legs

- Black or red hair on one or more legs beginning at the hoof and extending unbroken to or above the knee is considered "not" to be breed standard.
- One or more legs encircled with black or red hair which touches the hoof at any point is considered "not" to be breed standard.

While the majority of Brown Swiss calves are born white/cream in color, their color will change with age.

There are still characteristics that can be seen and recognized when looking at a calf.

- A solid dark charcoal grey/black nose (no spots).
- Solid dark charcoal gray/black hooves (no dis-colorings).
- The switch should be a chocolate brown/ black (no light shades).

Tail

- No black or red hair arising from the extreme 5 cms of the tail bone.
- The last 5 cms of the tail bone must be white.
