Drenching of livestock at any exhibition is prohibited except as permitted for a medical condition when diagnosed by a licensed veterinarian. Drenching means the action of using an instrument including a bottle, placed in an animal's mouth to orally administer a liquid, food, or any other substance. Animal I.D.: The only ear tags permitted are RFID ear tags or Scramble tag. All other tags will be removed by the Beef Committee prior to crossing the scales at Fair weigh-in. It is against the law to remove any EID or other USDA Official animal I.D.   Weight Requirements: Market beef must weigh at least 950 lbs. to be eligible for Champions and to sell in the Jr. Fair Auction. Underweights will be shown in a separate class.
