Goat Showman of Showmen Rep.</b> The Sr. exhibitor with the top skill-a-thon score between the Sr. Market Goat Showmanship winner and the Sr. Market Production Goat Showmanship winner will be the representative for Showman of Showmen.</p>	<p><b>Project Requirements:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>◆ <b>Market Goat Project Requirements:</b> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>A. Goat In the possession and care of the member by May 1<sup>st</sup>.</li> <li>B. Doe or wether born after Nov. 1 and by March 31.</li> <li>C. <b>Goat must be properly disbudded, properly castrated and healed or banded by May 1.</b> Goats with retained testicle(s) are <b>NOT</b> considered properly castrated.</li> <li>D. Each exhibitor must complete the on-line <b>2024 Clark County Jr. Fair Market Goat Exhibitor registration Form</b> by <b>Midnight May 1</b> identifying all market goats they are bringing to the Goat Tag-In. Must be tagged in at the May Tag-In.</li> <li>B. May tag-in five (5) market goats per member. Show two (2) and sell one (1) lot at Fair. No family goats!</li> <li>C. <b>All goats must be tagged/tattooed with an official USDA Scrapie number.</b></li> <li>D. <b>Project Animal Replacements:</b> If a member's market goat dies more than 60 days prior to Fair weigh-in, he/she may replace the dead market goat with another goat if approved by the Goat Committee. Member must contact the Extension Office <b>call 937-398-7599 or e-mail <a href="mailto:house.18@osu.edu">house.18@osu.edu</a></b> and replacement goat must be tagged by a Goat Comm. Member. If a goat dies less than 60 days prior to the first day of the Fair, an exhibitor may exhibit, show and sell an extra tagged goat of a sibling from the same household. Household means the permanent residence address of the exhibitor.</li> </ol> </li> <li>◆ <b>QA:</b> Market goat project members <b>are required</b> to attend an annual Quality Assurance Program <b>by June 1</b> to show at Fair.</li> <li>◆ <b>Skill-a-thon/Project Judging:</b> You <b>must participate</b> in the Clark Co. 4-H Skill-a-thon/Project Judging to complete your market goat project and show at the Clark Co. and/or Ohio State Fairs.</li> <li>◆ <b>Project Work:</b> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>A. Select at least 5 activities in your project level and complete.</li> <li>B. Complete QA and Animal Records for your project level.</li> <li>C. Participate in learning, leadership and citizenship activities.</li> <li>D. <p><b>135M Market Goats</b></p>		<p><b>Fair Requirements:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>◆ <b>Fair Entries:</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>A. Jr. Fair mgt. will make entry for market goats based on the Market Goat Exhibitor Registration and information from the May Tag-In/Weigh-In.</li> </ul> </li> <li>◆ <b>Weight Requirements:</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>A. Weigh a <u>min. of 50 lbs.</u> to show for class placing, champions and auction.</li> <li>B. Goats weighing <u>40 lbs. to 49 lbs. can show</u>, but are not eligible for championship drive &amp; can't sell in the Auction, but can go on the packer truck. Goats weighing <u>under 40 lbs. must go home by 11 AM, Sat., July 20.</u></li> <li>C. Market does and market wethers will show in separate weight classes in the Market Goat Show.</li> <li>D. Any market doe that crosses the scale may not be shown in the market production show or market production showmanship.</li> </ul> </li> <li>◆ <b>DUNF and United Producers Affidavit Requirements:</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>A. The exhibitor and/his/her parent/legal guardian must complete, sign and submit an on-line Drug Use Notification Form (DUNF) on each of his/her market goats by noon on Friday, July 19.</li> <li>B. Each exhibitor is required to complete an on-line UPI Exhibition Livestock Producers Affidavit for his/her market goat(s) to verify to UPI and feedlot purchasers that your market goats have not been fed ruminant derived animal proteins. This on-line form must be completed and submitted on-line by noon on Friday, July 19.</li> </ul> </li> <li>◆ <b>Health Rules:</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>A. Health papers <u>not required</u>. No symptoms of an infectious/contagious disease.</li> <li>B. <u>Official USDA Scrapie tag/tattoo required for all goats.</u></li> </ul> </li> <li>◆ <b>Show Ring Requirements:</b> You must use your own market goat in market goat showmanship and it must be a market goat that crossed the scales at Fair weigh-in.</li> <li>◆ <b>Division and Final Drive for Market Goats and County Produced Shows:</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>A. Top 3 from each class will show for top 3 in each division drive. Top 3 does and Top 3 wethers will show in the Overall Market Goat drive to select the Top 5 Overall Market Goats.</li> </ul> </li> <li>◆ <b>County Produced Market Goats:</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>A. Must be born and raised on the property of a Clark Co. Goat Producer prior to being sold and transferred directly to 4-H'er. Producer lives within Clark Co. and/or school district.</li> <li>B. Exhibitors wanting to compete in the Clark Co. Market Goat Producer Show must identify those goat(s) eligibility on the Clark Co. Jr. Fair Market Goat Exhibitor On-line Survey <a href="https://go.osu.edu/2024clarkcojrfairmktgoatexhreg">https://go.osu.edu/2024clarkcojrfairmktgoatexhreg</a> due by midnight May 1. No entry, No exceptions!</li> <li>C. Clark County Goat Producers will be contacted with a list of exhibitors and goats identified that they produced and sold to verify that they are the actual producer of those goats to verify final eligibility into the Clark Co. County Prod. Mkt Goat Show.</li> <li>D. Goat must show in Co. Produced and Market shows.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>	<p><b>Clark Co. 135M Market Goats		<p><b>Fair Requirements:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>◆ <b>Grooming and Prohibited Practices:</b>  <b>Unacceptable Practices include:</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>✓ Applying any electrical, mechanical, or other appliance that enhances, transforms, or changes the true conformation, configuration, or appearance of the goat.</li> <li>✓ Hitting, striking, beating, or otherwise impacting livestock that induces swelling or enhances, transforms, or changes the true conformation, configuration, or appearance of the goat.</li> <li>✓ Using ice, ice packs, cold packs, or cold compresses internally or externally other than in accordance with paragraph (S) of rule 901-19-12 of the Adm. Code.</li> <li>✓ Using a stomach tube or pump for any purpose other than for the relief of tympany or gas on the day of exhibiting.</li> </ul>                     Prohibited Grooming Practices include:                     <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>✓ Using any substance to enhance or change the color of the goat, including the goat's hide or hooves.</li> <li>✓ Using any substance (material, gas, solid or liquid) that conceals, transforms, or enhances the true conformation of goats, including by way of example but not limited to rope, false hair, graphite, hemp, and powders.</li> <li>✓ Pigmented grooming aides or materials.</li> </ul> </li> <li>◆ <b>Premier Exhibitor:</b> Market goat exhibitors earn points from Skill-a-thon/Project Judging, Showmanship and Market Goat Classes. Skill-a-thon Score worth 30%, Project Interview 10%, Project Book 10%, Showmanship 25% and Class Placing 25%. Age, division and overall winners announced at Showman of Showmen. Overall premier exhibitor can sell in the Sale of Champions. Results posted in the Goat Barn and Youth Building 4-H Winners Board by Noon, Thursday, July 25.</li> <li>◆ <b>Barn Rules:</b> Animals must be fed and watered daily, pens kept clean. No washing of goats in barns. <b>Keep all goats in or near Barns 1 and 5 unless entering the makeup or show arena to show or sell. Do not walk or take goats into or around the campgrounds, midway, food concessions, or other barns/buildings/or Champion Center areas.</b> Clip goats at home prior to coming to Fair and inspect for lice, seek veterinarian advice for treatment. Any clipping at Fair must be done away from the camper area.</li> <li>◆ <b>After Exhibition Animal Declaration On-Line Survey Form:</b> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>A. Each market goat exhibitor must complete an "After-Exhibition Animal Declaration Form" indicating where each market goat will be headed after exhibition. This form must be completed, signed and submitted on-line no later than 30 minutes after the conclusion of weigh-in.</li> <li>B. The After-Exhibition Animal Declaration Form serves to assist the Goat Committee, Sale Management and Fair personnel in tracking where animals need to go after the conclusion of exhibition thus helping to reduce load-out, auction, custom and packer mishaps.</li> <li>C. Failure to complete, sign and submit this form on-line by the designated deadline will result in forfeiture of the right to sell a market goat in the Auction.</li> </ol> </li> <li>◆ <b>Auction:</b> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>A. Each exhibitor may participate in the Auction with <b>ONE UNIT (OVERALL JR. FAIR ELIGIBLE MARKET EXPERIENCE)</b>. This unit consists of all eligible market projects in the Clark Co. Jr. Fair Auction (live or on-line) except for Champions.</li> <li>B. Overall Grand and Overall Reserve Champion Market Goats must sell in the Sale of Champions and if an exhibitor has multiple champions they will sell all champions.</li> <li>C. Overall Premier Exhibitor may sell in the Sale of Champions but are not required to do so unless also one of the Champions.</li> <li>D.
