Paper, Styrofoam, glass or ceramic receptacles for feed or water ARE NOT PERMITTED. <u>Springs are required to secure water bottles to the cages. No strings or zip ties. Pen risers of the exact pen size 20" x 20" may be used.</u> Bedding must be placed underneath the pens to absorb moisture. Exhibitors must clean pens daily by 8 AM. Must present pedigree of meat pen/fryer at check-in and should register Sr. buck and/or Sr. doe in the Junior Fair Show. C. A single fryer may not be part of the meat pen of rabbits. D. Overweight single fryers and/or meat pen rabbits may not be shown in the roaster class. E. Exhibitors can't show meat rabbits (single fryers, meat pen or roasters) in any other class. ◆ Weigh-In for Meat Rabbits: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> A. Each single fryer or meat pen rabbit must weigh 3 1/2 to 5 1/2 lbs. with no weight variance to be eligible to show and/or sell. B. Roasters must weigh a minimum of 6 lbs. and be less than 6 months of age at Fair weigh-in to be eligible to show and/or sell. C. Underweight and overweight rabbits may show and go on the packer truck, but are not eligible for Champions or to sell in the Livestock Auction. ◆ After Exhibition Animal Declaration Form: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> A. Each exhibitor may participate in the Auction with ONE UNIT (OVERALL JR. FAIR ELIGIBLE MARKET EXPERIENCE). This unit consists of all eligible market projects in the Clark Co. Jr. Fair Auction (live or on-line) except for Champions. B. Grand and Reserve Champion Singler Fryer, Single Roaster, and Meat Pen must sell in the Sale of Champions and if an exhibitor has multiple champions they will sell all champions. C. Exhibitors to sell in the Sale of Champions will need to move their Champion animals to the designated Hall of Champions area on the day and time set by the Sales Committee. ◆ Barn Rules and Required Equipment: Furnish own feed and bedding (straw or wood chips – no cedar). Attachable receptacles for feed and water are strongly recommended and must be present before animals will be cooped.
