Member must have access to the project dog by April 15th. B. Only domestic dogs six months and older by Fair Dog Shows. C. Agility dogs must be 18 months or older by Fair. D. Only the member may show their dog between April 15th until 4-H competition is complete at the Clark and/or State Fairs. E. Read, complete and sign the "Permission to Participate in 4-H Dog Activities Disclosure and Release of Claims Form" as part of the 4-H on-line enrollment submission by April 15th. ◆ Control and Approachability: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> A. Keep your dog under control and on leash at any 4-H dog event including Fair. Do not leave unattended at any time. B. Any dog in the 4-H Program may be required to be tested for approachability at any time during the 4-H year at the request of any Clark Co. 4-H Dog Club Volunteer, committee member, or Extension Educator. C. If an approachability test is requested due to an incident between two 4-H dogs, you must report it to the Dog Com. Chair person and the 4-H Ext. Educator by the next business day. Both dogs involved in the incident must be approachability tested within 2 weeks of notification, using a separate test dog that was not involved in the incident. CGC Tests #1 and #8 will be used. D. Any bite by a 4-H dog to a human or another animal at a 4-H event must be reported to the Dog Committee Chair and the 4-H Extension Educator by the next business day. ◆ Dog License and Vaccination Requirements: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> A. You must show proof of a current county dog license to participate in 4-H events for each 4-H project dog. B. You must have proof of current vaccinations given to each 4-H project dog by a licensed vet for rabies, distemper, hepatitis, leptospirosis, parainfluenza and parvovirus. If a vet has determined that a dog cannot receive a vaccination, the exhibitor must have a written document from the vet documenting the reasons. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i). To show at the county level, any proof of a current vaccination from the vet is acceptable including titer tests. (ii). Only the exhibitor can train the dog at any type of training classes, including 4-H, on or after the April 15 enrollment deadline. Instruction can include occasional demo by another person with a dog, as long as the 4-H'er is the only one training. ◆ Skill-a-thon Requirements For All Dog Projects: Required to complete project and be able to show at the Clark County and/or Ohio State Fairs. ◆ Project and Record Book: Bring Dog Project and Record 201 with complete up-to-date records for their dogs enrolled and documentation of at least 5 activities for your level. ◆ Project Interview: Answer questions about your project experience 4-H knowledge, project book and dog knowledge. ◆ Study: Dog Project and Record Book, Dog Resource Handbook and Dog Skill-a-thon Kit to prepare. ◆ Dog, Current Vaccination Record by veterinarian, License and Tags: Required for You and Your Dog and Dog Ambassador participants and for any 4-H dog event. ◆ Visual Display: Required for You and Your Dog project and any member wishing to enter in the Dog Poster Contest. <p>County Fair Requirements For Dog Projects:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ◆ Identification: All 4-H dogs must be identified with a laminated tag provided to the exhibitor by the Dog Committee. This ID tag must be worn by 4-H dogs at all times except when showing. ◆ Class Requirements: Check http://clark.osu.edu. ◆ Show Entries: All members must make entry by July 1st through Fair entry on-line at http://clarkohirfair.fairentry.com. One dog/class except for two dogs/class for Rally, Grad Novice and higher obedience. No substitutions or changes! ◆ Dog License and Vaccination Requirement: Proof of vaccination and dog license must be presented at fair check-in. ◆ Handling, Control and Approachability: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> Dogs must be kept under control and on a leash. Bitches in season, pregnant and/or lactating (nursing) bitches, and puppies under the age of 12 weeks are not permitted to be shown at the Clark Co. Fair and are not allowed on the fairgrounds at any time during the Fair. Exhibitors and their parents must attend to dogs at all times. Dogs that snap, bite or attempt to bite while in the ring at Fair must leave the ring, be removed immediately from fairgrounds for the remainder of Fair. B the next year regardless of score except Beginner Novice A can move to Beginner Novice B and/or Pre Novice. ✓ Beginner Novice A youth are not permitted to show the same or different dog in any other obedience class. ✓ Members may show the same dog in both Novice A and Pre-Novice in the same year at the county level, but may only show one at State Fair. A dog that has three qualifying scores at County or State Fair, in Beg. Nov B and/or Pre Novice must move to Preferred Novice or higher class the next year. A dog that has received a Beg. Novice title in AKC or equivalent may no longer show in Beg. Novice B at county or state level, and the Beg. Novice title will be considered as a qualifying score in Beg. Novice B. ✓ If a dog in Novice or higher wins with a qualifying score at County or State Fair in a B div. Class, it must move to the next level the following year. Sanctioned match must show during the 4-H project year at the same or higher level than they are showing in AKC, UKC, etc. B. Dogs who have completed their Comp. Dog (C.D.) Title or (UKC equiv.) prior to the 4-H deadline must show in Grad. Novice or higher. C. Dogs who have completed their Comp. Dog Excellent (C.D.X.) Use of Lead: All exercises performed on leash. C. Exercises: to heel on lead, figure 8, stand for exam, recall, long sit (one minute), and long down (1 minute). ◆ Judging Criteria for Preferred Novice Class: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> A. Eligibility Div. A: Neither 4-H'er or dog have had preferred novice Obedience experience prior to the current 4-H year. B. Eligibility Div. B: 4-H'er or dog has had preferred novice obedience experience prior to the current 4-H year. The dog has not had experience at the novice level. C. Exercises: Heel on lead and figure 8, heel free, stand for exam, recall, sit or down stay while handler walks around the ring and sit-stay while handler get their leash. <p>Obedience Show Class Progression: ✓ Youth may show 2 dogs in each of the following Obedience classes: Graduate Novice, Open, Graduate Open, and Utility provided youth and dogs meet requirements. Youth showing 2 dogs in "A" classes must meet the requirements that neither the youth and/or dogs have any previous experience at that obedience level. Youth and/or dogs cannot repeat the "A" class and a minimum must move to "B" in that level. See Ohio 4-H Dog Rules for further progression rules related to Advance Obedience.</p> <p>◆ Judging Criteria for Canine Freestyle: Youth may show one dog in a max of 2 Canine Freestyle classes with the following exception. Youth showing in Sassy Sr. Class may not show senior dog in another Freestyle class.</p>	<p>◆ Judging Criteria For Novice Classes: A. Exercises: heel on lead and figure 8, heel free, stand for exam, recall, sit-stay while handler gets their leash, long sit (1 min.) and long down (1 min.). Heel free, stand for exam and recall exercises done off lead.</p> <p>◆ Judging Criteria for Graduate Novice Classes: A. Use of Lead: All exercises performed off lead. B. Exercises: heel on leash, figure 8 off leash, drop on recall, dumbbell recall, dumbbell recall over high jump, recall over broad jump and stand-stay while handler gets their leash.</p> <p>◆ Judging Criteria For Open Classes: A. Use of Lead: All exercises will be performed off lead. B. Exercises: heel free and figure 8, command discrimination stand-down-sit, drop on recall, retrieve on flat, retrieve over high jump, broad jump, stand-stay get your leash.</p> <p>◆ Judging Criteria for Graduate Open Classes: A. Use of Lead: All exercises will be performed off lead. B. Exercises: signal exercise, scent discrimination, directed retrieve, moving stand and exam, go out and directed jump.</p> <p>◆ Judging Criteria for Utility Classes: A. Use of Lead: All exercises will be performed off lead. B. Exercises: signal exercise, scent discrimination article (1)(2), directed retrieve, moving stand and exam, and directed jump.</p> <p>◆ Judging Criteria for Rally Classes: A. Youth may show a maximum of two project dogs per Rally level. A level is Rally Novice, Intermediate, Advanced or Excellent. Youth may show the same dog or different dog in other disciplines/classes provided they meet req. B. Novice A and B classes and Int. A and B classes are performed on leash. Advanced and Excellent classes are performed off leash. C. Novice A is for the exhibitor and/or dog that has no training or showing experience in Rally prior to April 15. Once an exhibitor and/or dog shows in this class, they must move to Rally Novice B at the very minimum. This class can never be repeated by an exhibitor or dog. D. Novice B is for the exhibitor and/or dog who has had prior experience showing at the Rally Novice level prior to April 15. Exhibitors and dogs have not yet progressed to the Int. A level or higher. Once winning this class, the exhibitor and/or dog must move to Rally Int. A at minimum. E. Intermediate A is for the exhibitor and/or dog who have not had any training or showing experience at the Int. level prior to April 15. Once an exhibitor and/or dog has prior training or shows in Int. A, they must move to Int. B at minimum. F. Int. B is for the exhibitor and/or dog who has shown in Rally Int. A or has had any training or showing experience at the Rally Int. level prior to April 15. Once winning this class, must move to Advanced at a minimum. G. Advanced is for the exhibitor and/or dog who have not had any training or showing experience at the Rally Adv. level prior to April 15. Once winning this class, must move to Excellent. H. Excellent is for the exhibitor and/or dog who have not had any training or showing experience at the Rally Excellent level prior to April 15. Exhibitors that win this class may repeat this class.</p>
