If a project market hog dies less than 60 days prior to the first day of the Fair, an exhibitor may exhibit, show and sell a market hog identified on a sibling's <b>Fair Entry</b> from the same household. Household means permanent residence address of exhibitor.</li> <li>◆ <b>Ear Notching:</b> Market hogs must be ear notched for I.D. purposes.</li> <li>◆ <b>Youth QA Requirement:</b> Market hog project members are <b>required</b> to attend an annual Youth Quality Assurance Program <b>by June 7</b> to show and/or sell at the Clark County and/or Ohio State Fairs.</li> <li>◆ <b>Skill-a-thon/Project Judging:</b> You <b>must participate</b> in the Clark Co. 4-H Skill-a-thon/Proj. <p><b>139 Market Hogs</b></p> <p><b>Grooming and Prohibited Practices:</b> All animals giving evidence of any unacceptable practices or prohibited grooming practices as outlined in 901-19-13 and 901-19-33 of Ohio's Livestock Tampering Exhibition Rules will be barred from competition at the Clark County Fair. Drenching of livestock at an exhibition is prohibited except as permitted for a medical condition when diagnosed by a licensed veterinarian. Drenching means the act of using an instrument, including a bottle, placed in an animal's mouth to orally administer a liquid, food, or any other Substance.</p>	<p><b>Grooming Rules:</b> Slick clipping /body shaving hogs is prohibited except on ears and tails. All market hogs checked for hair length prior to going on the scales at Fair weigh-in. Hogs with less than ½ inch hair will be put on a call back list. Call back hogs will be rechecked at the conclusion of weigh-in for a final hair score. Disqualified hogs must be removed from the fairgrounds by Noon on Sunday by the exhibitor. Clipping and snaring of hogs on the fairgrounds is strictly prohibited. Water only for grooming! Come to the show ring with water only on your pig and in the ring.</p> <p><b>Barn Rules:</b> No Fans! Clean Out Pens! Use Shavings or Sawdust. No straw! Dumping manure in unauthorized areas can result in not showing and/or selling.</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>◆ <b>Weight Requirements:</b> Only one trip per pig across the scales. Exhibitors with market hogs weighing in <b>under 200 pounds and over 300 pounds</b> are not eligible to show in the Jr. Show, County Farrowed or Showman or Showmen Contest.</li> <li>◆ <b>Health Rules:</b> Health papers and pseudorabies test <b>not required</b> if the hogs originated within Ohio. Hogs born or purchased outside of Ohio must have a vet health cert. and be neg. to a pseudorabies.</li> <li>◆ <b>Drug Use Notification Form On-Line Survey:</b> The exhibitor and his/her parent/legal guardian must complete and sign a Drug Use Notification Form (DUNF) on-line survey by 30 minutes after weigh-in on each of his/her market hogs.</li> <li>◆ <b>After Exhibition Animal Declaration Form On-Line Survey:</b> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>A. Each swine exhibitor must complete an "After Exhibition Animal Declaration Form" indicating where each market hog will be headed after exhibition. This on-line survey must be completed and signed no later than 30 minutes after weigh-in.</li> <li>B. The After-Exhibition Animal Declaration Form serves to assist the Swine Committee, Sale Management and Fair personnel in tracking where market hogs need to go after the conclusion of exhibition thus helping to reduce load-out, custom and packer mishaps.</li> <li>C. Failure to complete and sign by the designated deadline will result in forfeiture of the right to sell a hog in the Clark Co. Jr. Livestock Auction.</li> </ol> </li> <li>◆ <b>Declaring Market Hogs To Go Home:</b> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>A. Exhibitor must identify on the Animal Declaration On-Line Survey due by 30 minutes after weigh-in which market hog(s) they are taking home.</li> <li>B. Load out declared take home pigs on Monday or Tuesday of Fair between 8 PM and 9 PM at the loading chute at rear of show arena.</li> </ol> </li> <li>◆ <b>Show and Sale Ring Requirements:</b> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>A. <b>MUST</b> use your own animal for showmanship.</li> <li>B. Show and sell your own market hog(s) unless you have permission prior to the show/sale for another Jr. Fair exhibitor to show/sell.</li> </ol> </li> <li>◆ <b>Auction:</b> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>A. <b>Each exhibitor may sell ONLY ONE ELIGIBLE ANIMAL UNIT (regardless of species) in the Clark Co.
