- Dairy Feeder Book - \$6.44
- Dairy Market Steer Book - \$6.44
- Dairy Resource Handbook (needed for Dairy Heifers and Dairy Cows) - \$17.20
- Beef Resource Handbook (needed for Dairy Feeders and Dairy Market Steers) - \$19.08
