4-H Activity Fees - Don't Wait Pay Now!

All 4-H members and cloverbuds must pay their annual 4-H activity fee no later than May 22.

2024 Activity Fees:

- \$25 per member and \$5 per cloverbud if paid by 7 PM, May 22
- \$30 per member and \$10 per cloverbud if paid after May 22

Purchasing 4-H Market Project Animals

Many of you are or soon will be purchasing market animals. There are breeder lists on the 4-H App under Projects tab. In addition, you may receive sale flyers from local breeders. We do not endorse anyone listed, these are provided as a courtesy to help provide you connections to potential local breeders and Jr. Fair Exhibitors who have purchased project animals from in the past.

Here are some important points to keep in mind when purchasing All Market Animals:

- Purchase healthy animals from reputable breeders.
- Know what vaccinations and parasite control has been completed by the breeder.
- Ask the breeder what feed the animal has been on to be able to transition the animal to your feed.
- Quarantine animals bought if you have other animals at home.
- Observe purchased animals closely for signs of illness take their temperature, monitor eating and drinking, observe changes in feces, etc.
- Monitor animal growth to know the animal is on target to meet weight requirements.
- Establish a valid VCPR (vet, client, patient relationship) for preventative care and treatment.
- Properly handle your animals and provide proper animal care to assure you have a healthy animal to bring to Fair. All animals must be free of contagious disease this includes ring worm, sore mouth, club lamb fungus, warts, lice, etc.





Market Goats and Lambs

- ALL market goats and market lambs must have a scrapie tag or tattoo. Scrapie tags must come from the breeder of the lamb or goat and are needed for on-line exhibitor registration due by May 1. Market lambs or market goats without scrapie tags will not be tagged in on May 11 and will not be eligible for show at the Clark County Fair.
- Market goats must be properly castrated and healed or banded and disbudded and healed by May 1. If not, they will not be tagged in on May 11.

Market wether lambs must be properly castrated.

Market Hogs

- Must be ear notched. Know your pig's ear notches. Record in your project book animal inventory section to have to complete your on-line Fair entries http://clarkohjrfair.fairentry.com due by May 15. Required to submit 2 photos with your market hog entries. One must be a side profile and the other one must be a head shot with ear notches of both ears clearly shown.
- Purebred market hogs must have registration papers in the exhibitor's name by fair weigh-in. Make sure you work with the breeder to have registration papers processed at purchase time. Don't wait! **Commercial Market Hogs** apply by March 15 at

Dairy Feeders

- Must be purebred, single breed, Holstein or Brown Swiss, male calves.
- Must be properly castrated and dehorned before the May 11 tag-in and weigh-in. If not, they will not be tagged or weighed-in NO EXCEPTIONS! You will have until June 1 to have your calf properly dehorned and/or castrated, receive first vaccinations, if completed by June 1, calf will be tagged, but will not be eligible for Rate of Gain.

Market Rabbits

- Roasters must be purebred, single breed, commercial rabbits, born after Jan. 21 & at least 8 weeks old on April 13, Rabbit I.D. Day. Roasters MAY BE PURCHASED or be offspring from your rabbits.
- Single Fryers and Meat Pens MAY NOT BE PURCHASED. Must be the offspring from a mating of the same single breed buck and doe owned by the member brought to Rabbit I. D. Day on April 13. Jr. Fair Rabbit Exhibitor Registration https://go.osu.edu/2024clarkcojrfairrabbitexhreg You must register the doe(s) and buck(s), you are breeding to produce your meat rabbits by April 11.

Market Ducks and Chickens

- Must be purchased and shown from the Clark Co. 4-H & FFA R & P, bulk order. by April 14.
- Must purchase required minimum. Market Turkeys min. of 6, Market Ducks min. of 3, Market Chickens min. of 6 per family with at least 3 per member in family. No 4-H Club or Chapter Orders.
